

## Fear This!

I'm sure many of you have seen this slogan, and its counterpart, NO FEAR.

Recently I have been pondering fear and its effects: What happens when I am fearful? How will it shape my thoughts and actions? Should I focus on not being fearful? Is all fear wrong? Does fear cause greater faith or increased doubt? Which slogan should I follow?

Fear is a common emotion we experience. It is a natural response to danger, either real or imagined. Sometimes fear is an overreaction to circumstances that are not dangerous, but are undesirable. One example is seeing a mouse and responding by screaming. Most of us agree that this fear is unfounded since there is no way such a small creature could cause harm to a person who is far superior in weight and strength. However, the rush of adrenalin and desire to flee when one sees a grizzly bear helps us avoid danger liable to result in death.

Other circumstances where we are fearful but the objects of, or reasons for, our fear are less obvious are situations of fearing people or fearing what God may, or may not do for me.

Youth are often cited as examples of people who fear their peers' opinions of them. In reality, most of us can identify with this fear; we don't outgrow it with age. Our natural response to this fear is to do what we think will please others and gain their acceptance, for even a moment, even if we later regret our actions.

Recently I identified my own fear about what God would or would not do for me. When we received payment for a

door we manufactured and delivered to clients, parts of the check were cut off, rendering it of no value. My first reaction was anger that they would be so inconsiderate as to not pay us for services rendered. After examining my feelings, I recognized my main problem was fear of not getting the money. Ultimately I lacked trust in God to provide for me whether I received the money or not.

Whether it's mice or grizzlies, people or God that we're afraid of, a natural response to avoid fear's control is to tell ourselves, "I am not going to be afraid." It's the "No Fear" slogan made flesh. It's an attempt to be self-sufficient people in a world where we desperately need God. And it gets us nowhere, except exhausted, anxious, angry, and estranged from God as we attempt to live without Him.

The best response is to cast all our cares on God. He truly cares for us and wants what is best for us. Many instances in His Word show us his care. Notice God's care when Hagar was in the desert waiting for Ishmael to die: "And God heard the voice of the lad; and the angel of God called to Hagar out of heaven, ... 'fear not; for God hath heard the voice of the lad where he is.'"



### “Fear This” Continued

When Peter stepped out of the boat to walk on the water toward Jesus, he did fine until he became afraid. Imagine his thoughts: “It’s impossible to walk on water!” Being a fisherman, he knew the consequences of being overcome by water. In the end, his fear of drowning overcame his trust in the Lord. The beautiful part is that Jesus reached out in spite of Peter’s fear and saved him.

So, how do we handle fear? God’s word tells us that “the fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom.” Or, “Fear This!”—Fear the Lord. When we fear the Lord we have a reverential awe of Who He is and what He is able to do. We learn to know Him as our Savior, Sustainer, and Comforter. We learn that all situations are within His control and according to His will; they are all smaller and less powerful than He is. As we fear Him and learn to know Him, we will run to Him with our fear and He will replace our fear with peace.







#### AMISH BY ADOPTION | Audio Book


