CLEAN HANDS

"Remember to wash your hands" is a phrase we have all become very familiar with since the Covid-19 pandemic has affected our world. We have all seen the reminder signs, including instructions how to properly wash our hands. I know many people find it silly that we need step by step procedures how to wash our hands.

As I reflect on our current world situation and the effort people have put forth to keep from contracting the virus, my mind turned toward keeping my hands clean spiritually. We know all about keeping our hands clean physically, but what about keeping our hands clean spiritually?

Sin is a far more serious problem than the Covid-19 pandemic we are currently facing. While the death rate for those who contract Covid-19 is estimated to be 1% - 3%, the death rate for sin is 100%.

I was challenged recently in reading from Psalm 24:3-5:

Who shall ascend into the hill of the Lord? Or who shall stand in his Holy place? He that hath clean hands and a pure heart; who hath not lifted up his soul unto vanity, nor sworn deceitfully. He shall receive the blessing from the Lord, and righteousness from the God of his salvation.

The Psalmist, David, asks "Who shall ascend into the hill of the Lord? Or who shall stand in his Holy place?" Under the First Covenant in the Old Testament, the presence of the Lord resided in the Holy of Holies, the most Holy place inside the tabernacle. Entering that sacred room to offer a sacrifice for sin necessitated a consecrated priest; carelessness could result in instantaneous death.

As a child of God under the Second Covenant, I am extremely blessed to have the presence of God (Holy Spirit) within my heart and mind at all times. However, with that privilege comes the

responsibility to keep my heart pure, which keeps my hands clean. I need the daily washing of the Word to keep my heart clean.

Since the Covid-19 pandemic began, many people have been vigilant in washing and disinfecting their hands. Why is that? Because they are concerned about contracting or transmitting the Covid-19 virus. But what about the sin problem we face? Are we just as concerned about contracting or transmitting that?

While all the soap and hand sanitizer in the world won't eliminate the problem of sin in our world, there is good news. There is a cure for sin! That cure is Jesus Christ. The answer to our sin problem is to repent of our sins and personally walk with Jesus as our Lord and Savior. The blood of Jesus Christ is a sufficient sacrifice for sins. The grace of Christ is available to help us in our daily walk of life. The grace we receive is the means by which Christ's blood cleanses our heart as we wash regularly with the water of the Word.

This figurative language becomes real when we live in obedience to the instructions He gave us. He loved us enough to give us simple ways to fight the sin that continually wants to infect our thoughts, words, and deeds. But we need to live them out in real life. To do this, He also gave us each other to help in our battle to remain clean. He tells us to fellowship with love, edify, wait for, admonish, bear with, be kind to, talk to, comfort, serve, restore, teach, exhort, warn, rebuke and speak truth to one another.

Health leaders have frequently reminded us of the value of social distancing to prevent infections. As believers, we do well to distance ourselves from sin and all the filth in our world. But it also important to draw near to God and find spiritual cleansing in Him when we do get defiled by sin (Heb. 10:22).

The Lord blesses with peace those who seek him with clean hands and a pure heart. There is so much unrest and uncertainty in our world. There is, however, rest and certainty in knowing Christ and serving Him. He offers us a peace that passes all understanding.

Deeper Life Ministries just made the painful decision to cancel the Single Ladies Seminar. That's the third cancelled seminar for us this year due to COVID 19. We can't escape the changes. Considering such things as a world-wide pandemic, economic upheaval, shifts in national ideology and resulting civil unrest, political viciousness that affects even "separated" people, upcoming election discord and other changes affecting us, here are three things to keep in focus.

1) Remember who our God is. Our god is not national well-being or righteous political policies. It is not wellness, nor safety. We are here to serve God in a war zone, patriots to Christ's kingdom. Our life and breath are His concern.

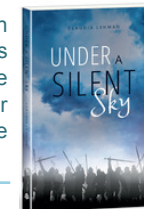

by Claudia Lehman | Softcover, 337 pages | \$9.99

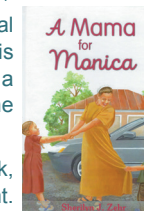

THE MISSING INVITATION

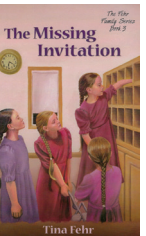

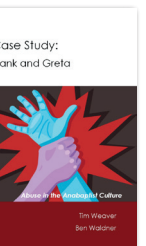
