My Brother’s Keeper

“Am I my brother’s keeper?” This is a question with many implications. Today’s society is more connected than ever: we have hundreds of friends on Facebook, and thousands of followers on Instagram. But does this translate into closer relationships and better community? People in the virtual world don’t know the real me, and it’s very easy to present myself in the best possible light. To push back against shallow relationships based on faulty impressions, we need to keep church community relationships close and real.

We will look at two Biblical examples that shed light on the question, “Am I my brother’s keeper?” Our first example is the tragic account of Cain killing Abel. How could it be that one generation removed from creation, one step away from parents who walked with God, we have sibling hatred that led to murder? God instructed Cain to resist the sin that he was facing (Gen. 4:6). He told him how to overcome sin and thus remain in right relationship with God. God warned Cain that sin was ready to pounce and overwhelm him. God was near and would help him. If he chose to let sin reign in his heart, it would master him. Instead of being open with God and his brother about his problem, he chose to do it alone. In Cain’s mind, Abel was an enemy rather than an ally against sin. This led to the first murder in the history of man.

Our second example is not of biological brothers, yet these two men had a closer relationship than many brothers do. 1 Samuel 18 records the story of the unlikely relationship of an anointed, future king and a prince. David, a young shepherd, rises out of obscurity, and becomes the hero when he defeats

Goliath. Jonathan, a brave soldier, is the likely heir to his father’s throne. What transpired that they shared this close relationship? Why wasn’t Jonathan jealous of David? We actually observe Jonathan pleading David’s case to his father, the king. Jonathan could simply have waited for his father to kill David, and then waited in line for the throne. Instead, Jonathan put his life on the line for David.

So how do we answer the question, “Am I my brother’s keeper?” These two examples have starkly different outcomes. In the first example, we have one brother who is jealous of the other.

Counselor’s Thoughts

From the Desk of Ben Waldner



Psalm 113 begins and ends with these words: “Praise ye the LORD.” Although this is a relatively short Psalm, the theme of praise to the LORD is mentioned four times. If someone says something four times, it must be really important, and the hearers may be likely to forget it. As if repeated mention isn’t enough, we’re urged to praise the LORD “from the rising of the sun unto the going down of the same” (v. 5). The Psalmist gives three reasons for praising the LORD. First, we should praise the LORD because He is exalted in honor, might, and authority beyond all nations, higher even than the heavens (vv. 4, 5). This calls for praise. Second, we should praise the LORD because He humbles Himself to help the poor and needy (vv. 6, 7). The distance from the highest heaven to earth is unfathomable. That the exalted One would reach down to the ash heap calls for praise. Finally, we should praise the LORD because He lifts the needy out of their predicament and exalts them (vv. 8, 9). From beggar to prince, from sterile to motherhood: now that’s something for which to praise the LORD. 🙌

My Brother’s Keeper Continued

Cain wanted acceptance from God, but he wanted it on his terms. This attitude led to wrong actions resulting in a life of loneliness and exile, banished from people, and fearful of community. Consider some of Cain’s final recorded words, “It’s too much ... I can’t bear it ... If people find me they will kill me.” In our second example, we don’t have record that Jonathan and David ever saw each other after the farewell in 1 Samuel 20. However, in that farewell, there were tears, blessings, and promises made. There was sorrow, but they had peace with each other.

Which one of these examples shows true brotherhood?

From these examples we see that a proper relationship with God is essential to brotherhood. Struggles in relating to brothers often indicate a struggle with God’s plan. Sin waits to overtake us. Bad attitudes toward God often result in harming those we fellowship with. Jealousy of what God is doing in someone else’s life will result in resenting their successes, or worse, hating them. Jealousy was not an issue between Jonathan and David. Why not? First, Jonathan recognized that God was using David to fulfill His plan. Second, Jonathan rejoiced that God delegated him a role in the kingdom. In Galatians 5:5 we learn that tearing down a brother only leads to our own demise. So, the next time you face the question, “Am I my brother’s keeper?” evaluate your relationship with God and your relationship with your brothers. Seek God’s vision for the Kingdom, fulfill your role, and rejoice that He called you to be part of His plan. 🙌

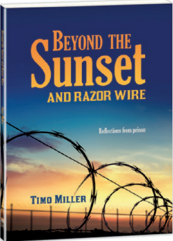


BEYOND THE SUNSET AND RAZOR WIRE

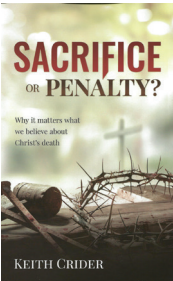


SACRIFICE OR PENALTY

Keith Crider | Softcover, 114 pages, \$6.49

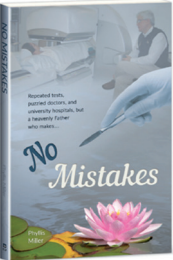

Phyllis Miller | Paperback, 211 pages, \$8.99

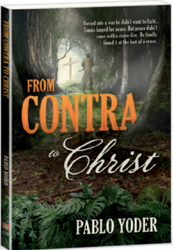

Then visitors arrived in Waslala, bringing the Gospel of peace. Little by little, their words and prayers began to affect Tomas’s cold heart. At the foot of the cross, he found forgiveness and true peace. This is his story.
