Are You Equipped?

Our DLM Bible study time often results in interesting discussions. Currently we are studying Colossians chapter 3, which focuses on the change that is possible in our lives because of what Christ has done. Paul discusses this process of change, which we summarize as putting off old habits and putting on new ones. We call this process sanctification. As we have progressed through the chapter, we’ve discussed a number of practical applications of this.

A particularly interesting verse is 16. The NRSV puts it this way: "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God." This verse is packed with practical direction, but let’s focus on the phrase, “teach and admonish one another in all wisdom.” It is interesting to note who does the teaching and admonishing and to whom it is done. Paul says one another. That’s you and me! That’s all of us, not just the elders or pastors or intellectuals. That’s an awesome challenge! Paul also tells us how to do it: with wisdom. We need to learn how to teach and admonish with wisdom, and to receive them with wisdom. It goes both ways.

But, if you are like me, it’s easy to see that this is something few of us know how to do well. We really don’t know what it looks like, either. So, if we don’t really know what it looks like, maybe we can tell what a lack of it looks like. In other words, what are some of the symptoms of practicing one-anothering poorly? Some significant ones are an increasing dependency on standards and rulemaking for sanctification, more shallow conversations, hurting members

going unnoticed, lack of transparency and involvement, increasing criticisms, and an increase in counseling centers.

Whoa! Did you notice the last one? An increase in counseling centers. Think about that a moment. If you are inclined to disagree with this, consider some things good counseling centers do for those they help: They love them, seek to know them personally, seek to know their circumstances in life, show them affection, show them kindness, accept them, bear their burdens, tell them the truth in love, teach and admonish them, encourage them, exhort them, provoke them to love and provoke them to good deeds. These things are all done intentionally and wisely. The interesting part of this is that every one of the things listed here are described by Paul in his writings as things to be done by and for one-another in the Church. They need to be done on purpose. They don’t just happen.

All people experience problems to one degree or another. Some need intentional help to deal with them. Often though, for a variety of reasons, they don’t get that help at home. Why not? Circumstances differ of course, but Paul, in Romans 15:14, compliments the Roman church

in their ability to do this very thing. We know they had the heart for it, since Paul says they were full of goodness. We know they knew how to do it, since Paul says they were filled with all knowledge. We know they did this kind of work because Paul says they were able to admonish one another. We know they did it well because Paul took the time to give them this compliment. How did they get to that point? I believe it’s because they, in part, did what Paul said to do in Eph 4:11-13. The Church equipped itself to do this kind of ministering. Since God gave assignments to some in the Church to see that it happens, it’s reasonable to assume that it does not come naturally for most people.

My point is this: We all need to be equipped to minister to one another. It is possible. Done wisely and regularly, two things can result. One is that the local Church may be able to handle their problem situations. Second, and perhaps more important, is that some of those situations may be prevented. So, why not become equipped to one-another in your church? You can do it!

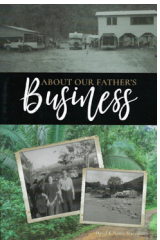

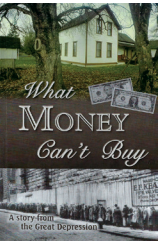


WHAT MONEY CAN’T BUY

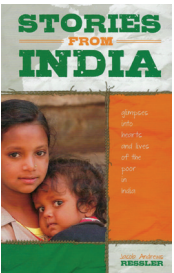

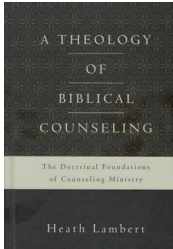


A THEOLOGY OF BIBLICAL COUNSELING

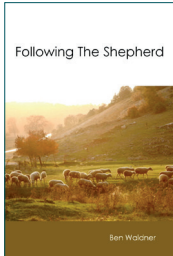

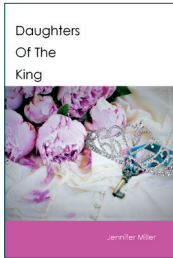
