



Good News

The darkness and silence was punctuated by a bright light and an angelic voice. The tidings? "Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you; ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger" (Luke 2:10-12). This angelic announcement to drowsy shepherds likely took them by complete surprise—and understandably so! But what was this "good news" the celestial herald proclaimed? Humanly speaking, they may have expected a repeal of Caesar Augustus's new tax law, or wool and lamb price increases at the local auction house. From a divine perspective, however, good news is not limited to dollars and cents. Following are several observations of what made the angelic announcement "good news."

Approximately 400 years had elapsed since Malachi, the last Old Testament prophet had spoken. He foretold of the forerunner of the Messiah, John the Baptist, but that prophesy remained unfulfilled. Four centuries of anticipation covers the lifespan of many people. During that interval there were numerous voices, but no "thus saith the Lord." Therefore, any word from God after 4 centuries would have been good news. And good news it was! In fact, the tidings of the birth of Christ were so good it had to be announced without delay. Although it took the shepherds by complete surprise, an angelic host was a most appropriate way to break that 400-year heavenly silence.

example, decisions affecting many residents of a country are generally communicated by its government or president. Similarly, policy changes in college or university are often conveyed via the president. In such circumstances, other dignitaries are usually standing by, observing the proceedings. When the angel announced the Savior's birth, the heavenly host escorting him could not hold back from joining in the chorus of praise. They brought tidings of peace to men on earth. Can you imagine the sound of that angelic chorus? "...and on earth, peace, good will toward men." Not a message of judgment or condemnation, but of peace.

During that spiritually dark time a birth announcement was proclaimed in the Judean countryside.

For centuries, the Jews were without a king. They were political prisoners, first of the Babylonians, then the Medes and Persians, the Greeks, and then the Romans. Israel's political slavery was reminiscent of her bondage to sin, from which the Savior would deliver. While the Jews anticipated a physical deliverance, God promised freedom to spiritual captives. The enemy, sin, is a tyrannical master. More ruthless and demanding than any political figure, sin's power had to be reckoned with. Who would take on this deadly enemy? Who would accomplish this task? King Jesus would! During that spiritually dark time a birth announcement was proclaimed in the Judean countryside. In the dark of night, the Savior was born. He would emancipate spiritual prisoners, and that indeed was good news!

Imagine how refreshing that news was after being taxed by the political ruler. And not only peace, but also good will. News of good will from heaven toward men after 400 years of silence would truly be cause for rejoicing.

In conclusion, consider how the news of the Savior's birth is still relevant for today. First, because God loved, he gave (John 3:16). The birth of Jesus is the demonstration of his love. By his birth God provides a Savior, through his death a redeemer. This is good news. Second, King Jesus conquered death and triumphed over the grave. He reigns triumphant and still sets spiritual captives free. That is also good news. Third, his grace is extended still. We are undeserving recipients of his kindness and benevolence. His favor is unmerited; his good will is toward men. That is marvelous news!

Important announcements are usually made public by significant figures within the organization. For

We recently reviewed all donations received through Anabaptist Foundation and discovered that additional funds need to be transferred to the Endowment Fund (per donor recommendation). The transfers will be completed as quickly as our operating fund allows. We are committed to honoring the funding recommendations of DLM's supporters.

We thank you for the many ways you support DLM and make it possible for the work to continue. May God richly bless you in this coming year.

Coming here has broadened my world in different ways: meeting my different people from different walks of life, and relating with them. Also it has broadened my own personal life, relationally and spiritually.




