

Satisfied?

While working outside one day this summer, I became very thirsty. The day was warm and humid, and it didn't take long to work up a sweat. I quickly devoured a glass of cold water, and for a few moments my thirst was satisfied. It wasn't long, however, until it seemed like I had never taken a drink. The satisfaction I received was only temporary.

The soul of man cries out for satisfaction. God made us that way so we would seek after Him. Satan sought satisfaction by trying to elevate himself to an equal status with God. We know what happened. Now he is busy deceiving others by crafting alternatives that temporarily satisfy the flesh, while creating an even deeper spiritual void. Some think they can find satisfaction by pursuing wealth. "If I win the lottery I'll have it made." For others, their goal is to be famous, or to have a house by the beach. Still others, the pursuit is centered around the vehicles they drive. Many in our day are obsessed with sports. "If only... then I will be satisfied." But somehow, when the plateau they thought would bring satisfaction is reached, they are disappointed. Instead of the satisfying thrill they envisioned, they are left with a desire for more. It is like an addiction where the highs no longer bring the sense of fulfillment they once did, and so an increased dosage is needed to achieve the desired level of satisfaction.

What is it that brings satisfaction? Jesus met a woman at a well in John 4, and requested a drink. The woman was shocked that Jesus, a Jew, would ask for a drink of water from a Samaritan, because the two ethnicities generally avoided each other at all costs. Even Jesus' disciples, upon their return, marveled that He spoke to a Samaritan. Jesus, however, laid aside those cultural differences and saw a soul seeking for satisfaction. He seized the opportunity to inform her that the water she was drawing from the well would provide only temporary relief, but He was the source that could provide permanent satisfaction.

Here was a woman who was seeking satisfaction in life, and by the discourse that is given, it is obvious her attempts were coming up short. Apparently, her numerous husbands were unsuccessful in meeting her expectations and so she parted ways in pursuit of

someone else. As Jesus outlined the plan of salvation, I find it interesting that she left her water pots setting by the well and returned to the city to tell others what she had found. (John 4:29) "Come, ...is not this the Christ?" She had found the living water!

Have you met Jesus at the well? Have you drunk of the water that springs of life eternal? If not, I invite you to come and meet the Master. You too can be satisfied.

John 4:6b -15 Jesus therefore, being wearied with his journey, sat thus on the well: and it was about the sixth hour. (7) There cometh a woman of Samaria to draw water: Jesus saith unto her, Give me to drink. (8) (For his disciples were gone away unto the city to buy meat.) (9) Then saith the woman of Samaria unto him, How is it that thou, being a Jew, askest drink of me, which am a woman of Samaria? for the Jews have no dealings with the Samaritans. (10) Jesus answered and said unto her, If thou knewest the gift of God, and who it is that saith to thee, Give me to drink; thou wouldest have asked of him, and he would have given thee living water. (11) The woman saith unto him, Sir, thou hast nothing to draw with, and the well is deep: from whence then hast thou that living water? (12) Art thou greater than our father Jacob, which gave us the well, and drank thereof himself, and his children, and his cattle? (13) Jesus answered and said unto her, Whosoever drinketh of this water shall thirst again: (14) But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life. (15) The woman saith unto him, Sir, give me this water, that I thirst not, neither come hither to draw.

Counselor's Report

From the Desk of Ben Waldner



As a staff at Deeper Life Ministries, we are studying the book of Colossians. A subject we are currently discussing is prayer.

Early on in the book Paul mentions that he and Timothy are "praying always for you" (Col. 1:3). Just a few verses later (v.9) he mentions that they have not ceased praying for them. The fact that he refers to the subject of prayer two times within just a few verses indicates that this was an important practice in the life of Paul and Timothy. Additionally, the fact that these men of God put such an emphasis on praying for the Colossian believers indicates that this was a vital ingredient for effective ministry. In other words, prayer was as essential to these gospel preachers as flour is to a bread maker. These observations encourage me to pray for fellow believers. Since Paul cultivated the practice of prayer, and since he was so effective in sharing the Gospel with unbelievers and faithfully teaching and encouraging the Saints, why should I not follow his example? Paul's example also encourages me to persevere in prayer. Starting a new project is often exciting for me; but a lack of persevering when it gets difficult has left many projects half-completed. I want to develop spiritual muscles by continuing to pray...even when it gets difficult.



Starla Kreider Spiral-bound, \$10.99*



Growing up in a Mennonite village in Russia, young Knals Plett became a man of sincerity and conviction—and stubbornness. When hidden bitterness drove him to commit a terrible deed, his stubborn will separated him from God, church, and family until he repented... An older and wiser Knals, now a leader in his community, led the way across another distance when the church faced political pressure. Along with many others, Knals' family made the long journey to Canada in 1875. Settled in Canada, Knals faced the most difficult divide of all. When his son left his father's church for another group, Knals was merciless. For years, his heart ached and his son suffered, but Knals would not yield. Then one frigid winter morning, an elderly Knals learned his son was stricken with typhoid. Knals was smitten by grief and guilt. Could he cross the chasm he had created? His son was dying on the other side. Based on historical accounts, *Crossing the Distance* is a story of great distances and a man who faced them. It offers hope that, by God's grace, we also can cross divides in our lives.
