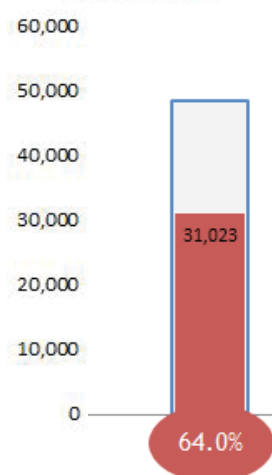

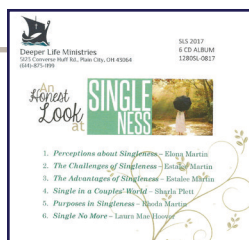

Little But Wise

The man is obscure in history possibly because his name was not very popular. In my research, I could not find any contemporaries by that name. Truth be told, if I would have wanted to give one of our sons that name, my wife would have objected. To his credit, the biblical figure, Agur, was a keen observer of nature and people, gave wise counsel, and his sayings are included in the sacred canon (Pro. 30:1-33).

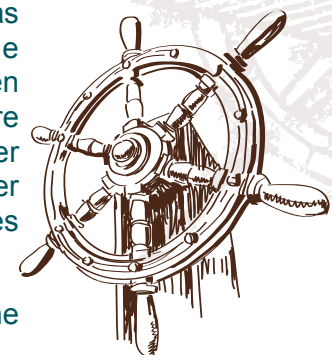
Agur observed four creatures that had the odds stacked against them due to their size, but because of their wisdom they thrived (Pro. 30:24-28). What creatures did Agur observe? What is the significance of these observations for the “little but wise” human? Consider with me the four creatures.

1. First, Agur notes that ants are of little strength, but are exceedingly wise (v. 25). Growing up, I recall numerous occasions coming upon an ant hill in a fence row. What looked like a pile of dirt mixed with straw was actually home to an ant colony. If ants were not busy on the surface, all it took was disturbing the home, and ants would appear by the hundreds. Seeming chaos was many tiny creatures working together to restore order. Instinctively, each ant knew what to do without instruction; oversized furniture was handled by two or more. The same ant hill could be disturbed during the winter months, but not a single ant would appear. Why no activity in cold months? First, these wise creatures knew there was a season of opportunity. Failing to seize the opportunity of warm weather during summer spelled death. Second, diligence in summer was essential in overcoming the challenges of living in a fallen world. Third, since they were little, survival during winter meant working together over summer. Single ant colonies are yet to be discovered.

2. Next, Agur observed the

coney (commonly known as the hyrax or rock badger) that looks similar to a ground hog, minus the tail (v. 26). These small creatures live in colonies and do not have the means to dig burrows, so their home is among rocks or boulders. One coney is on guard duty while the others feed, frolic, or rest. A shrill whistle alerts the colony of danger, and the large rocks provide a safe haven for these furry animals. Interdependence safeguards conies from predators' teeth or claws, and the rocks provide a safe haven for both young and old.

3. The third creature Agur observed is the locust (v. 27). This insect is related to and looks like a grasshopper. Although it is sometimes solitary, at particular seasons locusts congregate and travel by the millions without flying into each other or having squabbles. Although destructive to vegetation, Agur deems it noteworthy that these paperclip-size insects march together and create an unstoppable force. What advances are possible in homes, churches, communities, and govern-

Counselor's Thoughts

From the Desk of Denver Yoder



In his discourse with Apostle Paul, King Agrippa made this profound declaration, “Almost thou persuadest me to be Christian” (Acts 26:28). Paul seemed to recognize the folly of such thinking when he replied, “I would to God that thou were both almost and altogether such as I...” In Matthew 25, we read of the ten virgins who went out to meet the bridegroom. At midnight the call was made, “Go ye out to meet Him.” Five were ready, five were almost ready. Ananias and his wife Sapphira sold their possessions, and brought some of the proceeds and laid them at the apostles’ feet. A little dishonesty kept them from meeting God in peace. Almost they were ready. Dear friend, do you have any “almost” in your life? That apology you need to make. What about your struggle in personal daily victory? You feel condemned, and know you need to seek help, but the devil keeps you back – will you overcome, or will you almost be saved? Christ offers the resources needed to overcome. Whatever need or struggle you may be facing, allow Jesus to break that stony heart and surrender your will. Will you be “almost saved”? How sad to hear those words, “Depart from me; I never knew you.” Now is the day.

ments when we endeavor to march together?

4. The fourth creature Agur took note of is the spider (v. 28). Assuming the writer is referring to a common household spider, it is no small wonder that this creature finds its way to the royal residence. The spider apparently has no inferiority complex, nor is intimidation effective in dissuading it from its course. What is the secret to the spider’s success? Agur observed that the spider utilizes its “hands” to climb. The spider’s secret is simply putting one hand (or one foot) in front of the other, clasping with one and releasing the other. By diligently following this procedure, the spider achieves great success.

In summary, do you ever feel small and your contribution insignificant? Be encouraged and instructed by the small, but wise creatures. Notice how they too are small, so they seize the opportunities that arise before they slip away. They work diligently and overcome little by little. They also work together, because interdependence makes for longevity and stability.

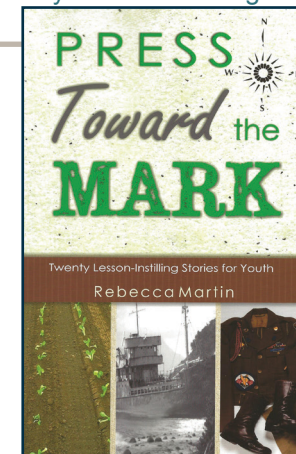

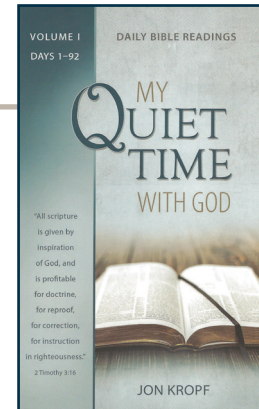
MY QUIET TIME WITH GOD
